Apprentice may start the program as early as age 16

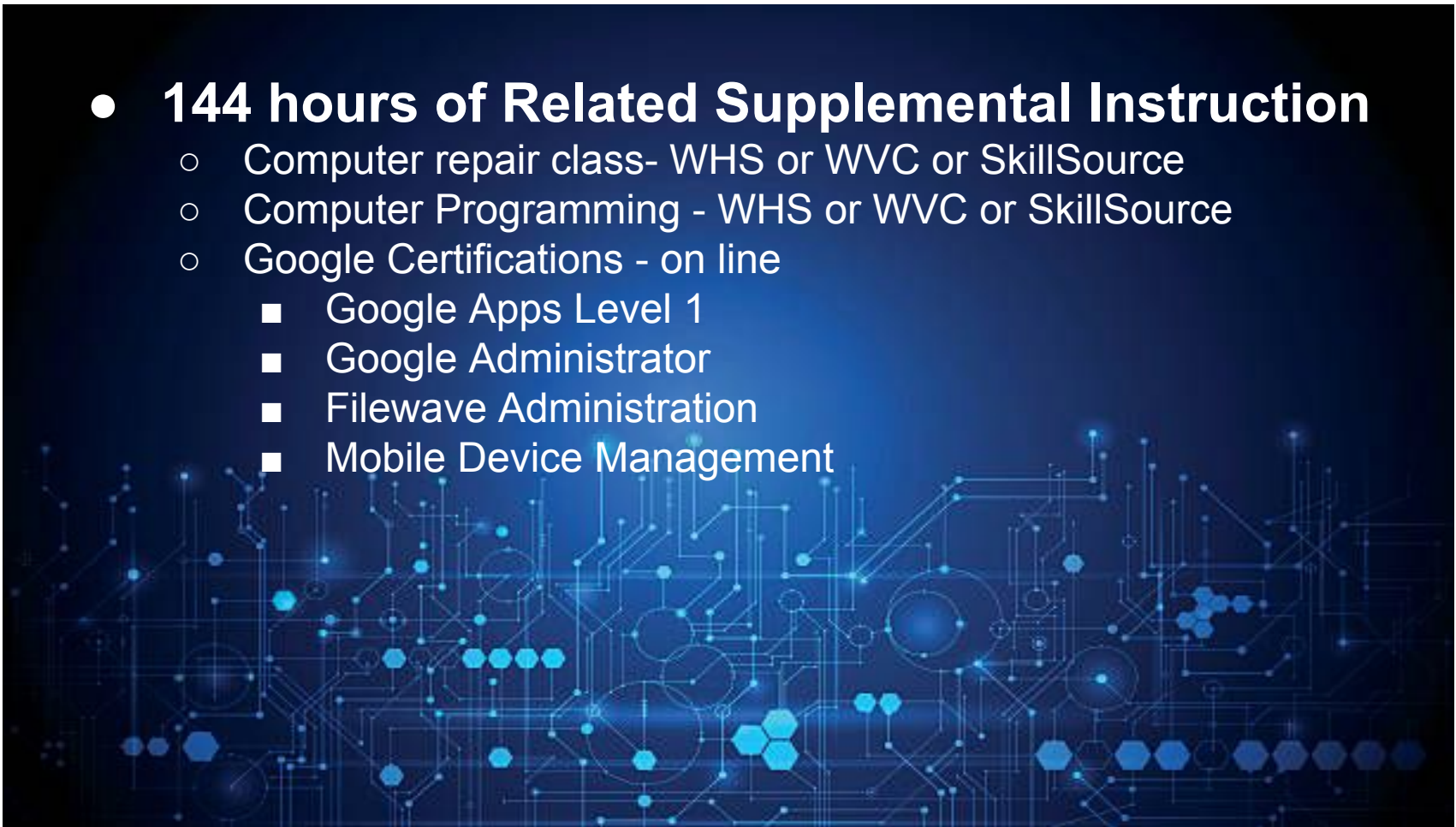
Work with a journeyman in operational or instructional technology

- **2000 hours of paid work experience**

- WSD employee
- Paid on a wage progression based on hours worked, % 80 to %100
- Under the supervision of a journeyman
- Given a variety of work experiences to meet the competencies outlined in the apprenticeship standards
- Progress reported to Labor and Industry monthly
- Students work part time during school, and full time during summer hours

● **144 hours of Related Supplemental Instruction**

- Computer repair class- WHS or WVC or SkillSource
- Computer Programming - WHS or WVC or SkillSource
- Google Certifications - on line
 - Google Apps Level 1
 - Google Administrator
 - Filewave Administration
